Additions

Transfer Academy

Richland Transfer Academy is available for juniors and seniors in high school who want to earn Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) college credits that count toward a college transfer degree and high school credits. Students attend Richland ½ day (taking 9-11 credit hours per semester, typically 3 courses) and attend their MFHS ½ day.

If a student is looking at a private or out-of-state university, the student should check with that institution to assure the credits will transfer appropriately. ALL CLASSES MAY NOT TRANSFER TO THE COLLEGE OF YOUR CHOICE.

Illinois Students participating in Richland dual-credit courses will be evaluated as college students and are expected to follow the rules and regulations of Richland Community College. Heartland Technical Academy

Students who experience the Tech Academy have an opportunity to learn specific technical skills as well as proper employment behaviors and positive work ethic characteristics. Students at the Tech Academy have access to a technology-enriched curriculum, taught by a highly competent staff, using state of the art equipment. Nearly all of our programs offer college credit through Richland Community College.

Heartland Technical Academy is dedicated to providing quality, hands-on educational experiences that build technical skills and instill work ethics that prepare students for college and career success. The administration and staff of the Tech Academy are committed to providing ways for students to transition successfully into education and career opportunities after high school. To meet this commitment we will:

- Create challenging, dynamic programs of study that will bring the classroom, workplace, and community together for the benefit of the students.
- Provide relevant curriculum and appropriate resources to meet the needs of our diverse student population.
- Continuously improve teaching and technology, while creating partnerships to benefit

CEO Program

In the Central Illinois CEO program, students will visit area businesses 2-3 times per week. This model is non-traditional and meets off campus at different locations Monday thru Friday 7:30-9:00 am. The students will learn from guest speakers, participate in a class business, write business plans, and start and operate their own businesses. Business concepts learned through the experiential CEO class are critical; the 21st century skills of problem-solving, teamwork, self-motivation, responsibility, higher-order thinking, communication, and inquiry are at the heart of a student's development throughout the course.

Updates - All updates are italicized followed by old description

AP U.S. History - The objective of this course is to increase the student's understanding of United States history with the goal of having each student pass the AP Examination. The course is divided into two semesters, Discovery through Reconstruction and The Gilded Age to the present. The areas of concentration include historical, political and economic history coupled with an intense study of cultural and intellectual institutions and their development. These areas will be studied from a variety of perspectives with the hope of providing a balanced view of history. This course is taught at a rigorous collegiate level. The major difference between a regular high school and college history course is the amount of reading and depth of focus. Moreover, the AP curriculum stresses higher order thinking skills within a rigorous academic context. Thus, the student will be required frequently to analyze, synthesize, and evaluate primary and secondary historical sources in addition to memorizing, comprehending, and applying facts. Students are required to take the National AP U.S. History exam in May when they register for this course. Students will pay for the exam in the high school office prior to December 1st.

Prerequisite: Students must complete World History with an A and Advanced English I with a B or better, or World History, English I, and English II with an A in all courses, or World History, English I with an A in all courses, and taking Advanced English II next year.

<u>AP U.S. History</u>- This course is a full-year introductory college course in the United States' history, which covers early colonization to the Clinton Years. The course will provide students with the analytical and informational understandings to arrive at a conclusion, and to then express that conclusion in essay form. Students also assess historical materials and then apply those materials to the reach original conclusions. **Students are required to take the National AP U.S. History exam in May when they register for this course. Students will pay for the exam in the high school office prior to December 1st**

Prerequisite: Students must complete World History and Advanced English I with a B or better in both courses, or World History, English I, and English II with a B or better in all courses, or World History, English I with B or better, and taking Advanced English II next year.

The County Clerks of the Counties (the "County Clerks") shall each give notice of the Election (the "Notice"), in accordance with the general election law by (i) publishing the Notice once not more than 60 nor less than 10 days prior to the date of the Election in a local, community newspaper having general circulation in the District, and (ii) posting a copy of the Notice at least 10 days before the date of the Election at their respective principal office.

Section 6. Local Notice. The Secretary of the School Board shall post a copy of the Notice at the principal office of the District.

Section 7. Newspaper of General Circulation. It is hereby found and determined that the Herald & Review is a local, community newspaper having general circulation in the District as required by Section 125 of the Election Code of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "Election Code").
