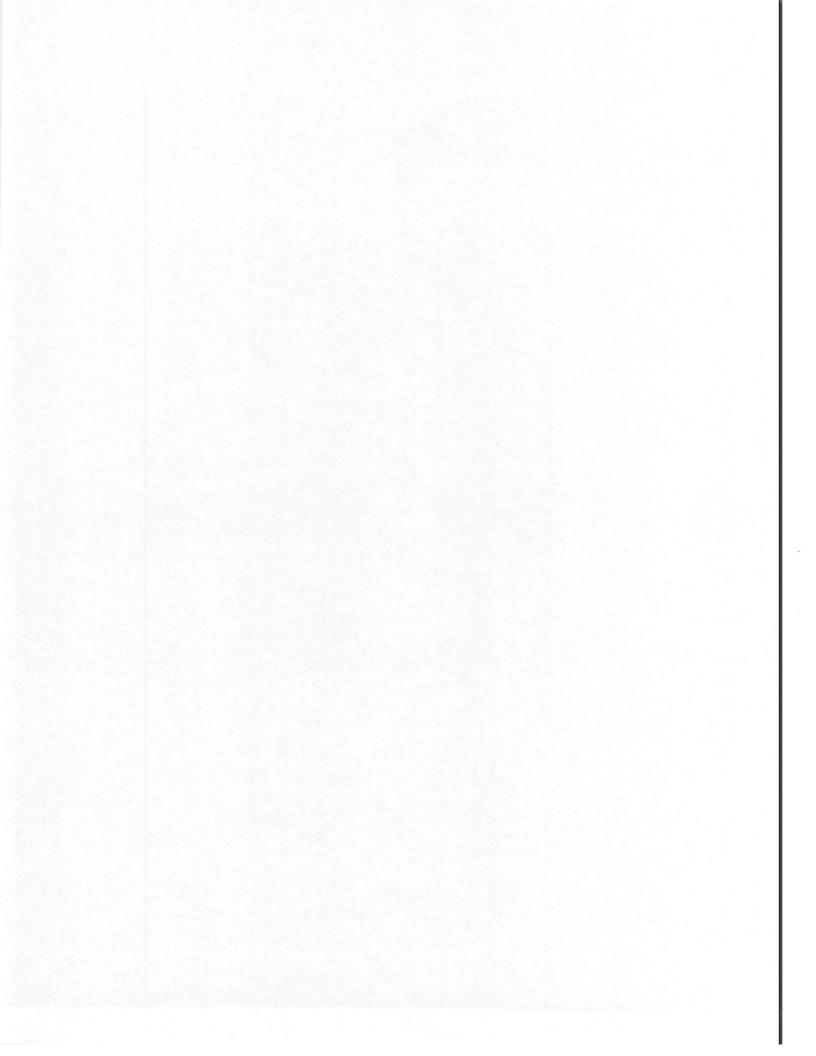

Updates - All updates are italicized followed by old description

<u>English I</u> - The purpose of this class is to provide learning experiences and opportunities for students to improve their individual reading, writing, and communication. This class will stress such language skills as grammar, sentence structure, proper usage, and numerous writing techniques. Students will be expected to demonstrate their ability to write well-structured paragraphs, essays, and personal responses. Reading skills will be further developed through a selection of numerous short stories, poems, and novels.

<u>English I</u> - The purpose of this class is to provide learning experiences and opportunities for students to improve their individual reading, writing, and communication. This class will stress such language skills as grammar, sentence structure, proper usage, and numerous writing techniques. Students will be expected to demonstrate their ability to write well-structured paragraphs, essays, short stories and a more extensive research paper. Reading skills will be further developed through a selection of numerous short stories, poems, and novels.

<u>English II</u> — This class will focus more extensively on reading comprehension, vocabulary building, effective communication skills, and more complex/creative writing. <u>English IV</u> — is a chronological survey of British literature and a practicum of the recognized forms of academic writing. Students will read and analyze complex texts to include fiction, nonfiction, drama, and poetry. Students will develop speaking, listening, writing, and critical thinking skills in preparation for post-high school employment, post-high school training, or college.

Prerequisite: Sophomores, juniors and seniors with an B or better in previous English class

<u>Psychology:</u> This semester course introduces the basic concepts of psychology such as the basis of behavior, child growth and development, learning, personality development and personality disorders. An emphasis will be placed on the development of critical thinking skills,

reading, writing, and research skills. The instructional format is designed to engage students in an interactive forum for discussion and analysis. This survey course is designed for active student involvement in terms of group activities and group and individual presentations. This is meant to be a challenging and fast moving course.

<u>Psychology</u> - Topics covered could include but are not limited to: research methods, states of consciousness, learning, intelligence and mental abilities, motivation, emotion, life span development, personality, stress, and psychological disorders.

American History: This study of United States History will provide comprehensive coverage of American history from prehistory to the post WWII Era and will follow the Illinois Standards of Learning. It will be a blending of social and political history combined with geography to provide students with a broad view of America's past and present. A multicultural perspective will be used and the skills of interpreting charts, primary sources, political cartoons, and other historical documents will be developed.

<u>U.S. History</u> - This course examines the history of the United States beginning with European exploration and concluding with current events. The class focuses on the social, economic, and political growth of the United States from 1492 to present. The major areas of study include: exploration, colonization, American Revolution, beginning government, Manifest Destiny, Civil War and Reconstruction, Industrial Revolution, Reform Movements, WWI, Roaring 20s, Great Depression, WWII, Cold War, Civil Rights, Vietnam, 1970s, Reagan Policies, Age of Technology, and Current Events.

Government: This course is a study of the origins, development, structure and functions of American national government. Topics include but are not limited to the constitutional framework, federalism, three branches of government, civil rights and liberties, political participation and behavior, policy formation and controversial topics related to our government today. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to demonstrate and understanding of the basic concepts, process and functions of our government and political system. Students must all take and pass both the US and Illinois Constitution tests as required by Illinois law.

<u>Government</u> - This semester course focuses on the organization and implementation of government within the United States. Topics to be discussed include the brief history of the Constitution, then an in depth study of the Constitution, state and local government including the Illinois Constitution, political parties and rights and freedoms guaranteed American citizens. Emphasis will be placed on the formation of the federal government,

real life examples of how the government operates, and how the government works for its citizens. The US and Illinois Constitution Exam state requirement will be covered in this course.

Yearbook: Participants will work in teams and individually to complete pages and publish the school's yearbook for that year. Responsibilities include taking and getting permission to use pictures from a variety of sources, advertising for and selling upcoming yearbooks, selling ads, creating and editing pages and meeting deadlines set for that work. Lessons and workshops will be provided in areas such as photography, advertising, reporting, editing and graphic design related to the yearbook. Students will be able to successfully use the online publishing program provided by our yearbook company. We will have required weekly meetings but students will be responsible for working on their own in order to get their work done well and on time.

Prerequisite: Sophomores, juniors and seniors with a grade of B or better in their most recent English class and prior approval from current yearbook sponsor

<u>Yearbook Publications</u> - We will have lessons in several different areas including photography, advertising, reporting, editing, and graphic design as it applies to yearbook. Next year we will be working with "Page Maker" on the computer to learn about layout designs. We will put the yearbook together for publication.

<u>Chorus</u> - High School Chorus is made up of all high students who are interested in singing. The course is mainly geared to performance, but includes some music appreciation and history through various sources such as outside activities, performances and current events in the musical world. The course covers such things as sight singing, reading music, and ear training. Performances given during the year are: Fall, Christmas, Classical, & Spring concerts, IHSA Organizational Contest, performance at the Hickory Point Mall, Macon County Choral Festival, as well as other performances that come up during the year. All Choir members are also required to take part in the annual Spring Musical. The goal for each student is to develop the voice so that it may be used in a musical group activity that will bring recognition and satisfaction to the individual and the group.

<u>Chorus</u> - High school chorus is made up of all high school boys & girls who are interested in singing. The course is mainly geared to performance, but includes some music appreciation and history through various sources such as outside activities and performances and current events in the musical world. The course covers such things as sight singing, reading music, and ear training. Solo work is encouraged and many students use study halls and after school hours for solo work. Performances given during

the year are Christmas concert, spring concert, state contests, performance at the Hickory Point Mall, Macon County Choral Festival, and Commencement, and other performances that come up during the year. Mainly - a goal is to develop the voice so that it may be used in a musical group activity that will bring recognition and satisfaction to the individual and the group.

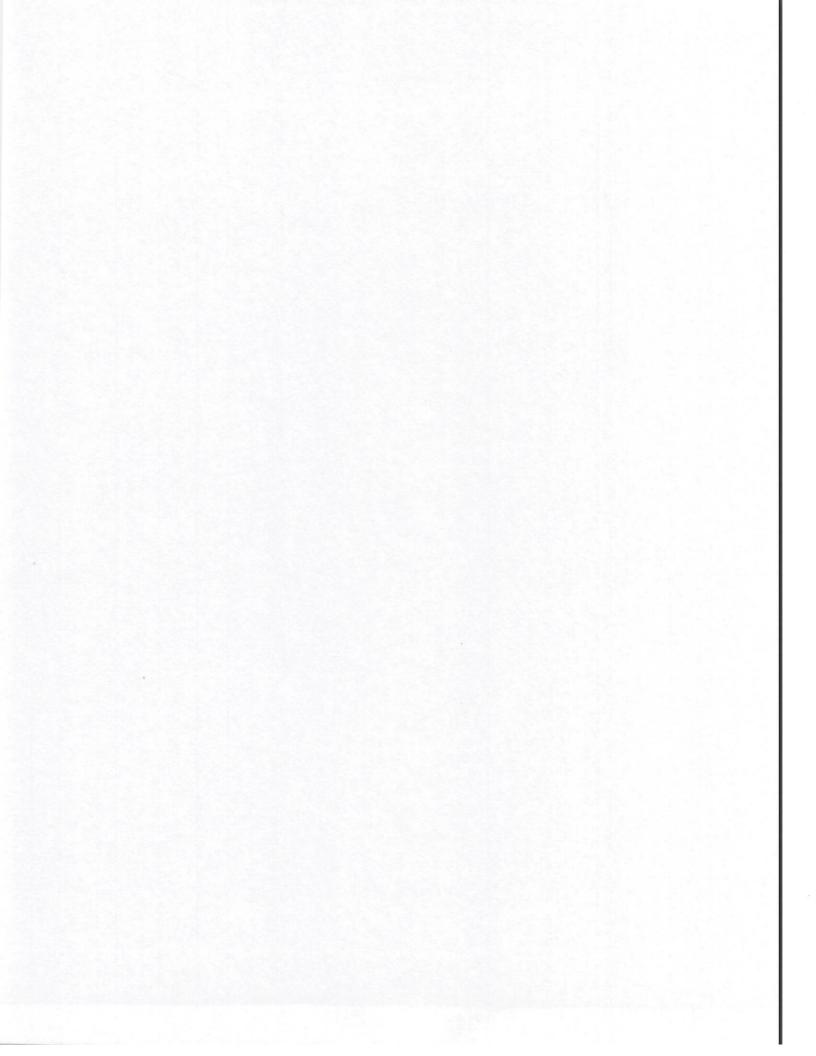

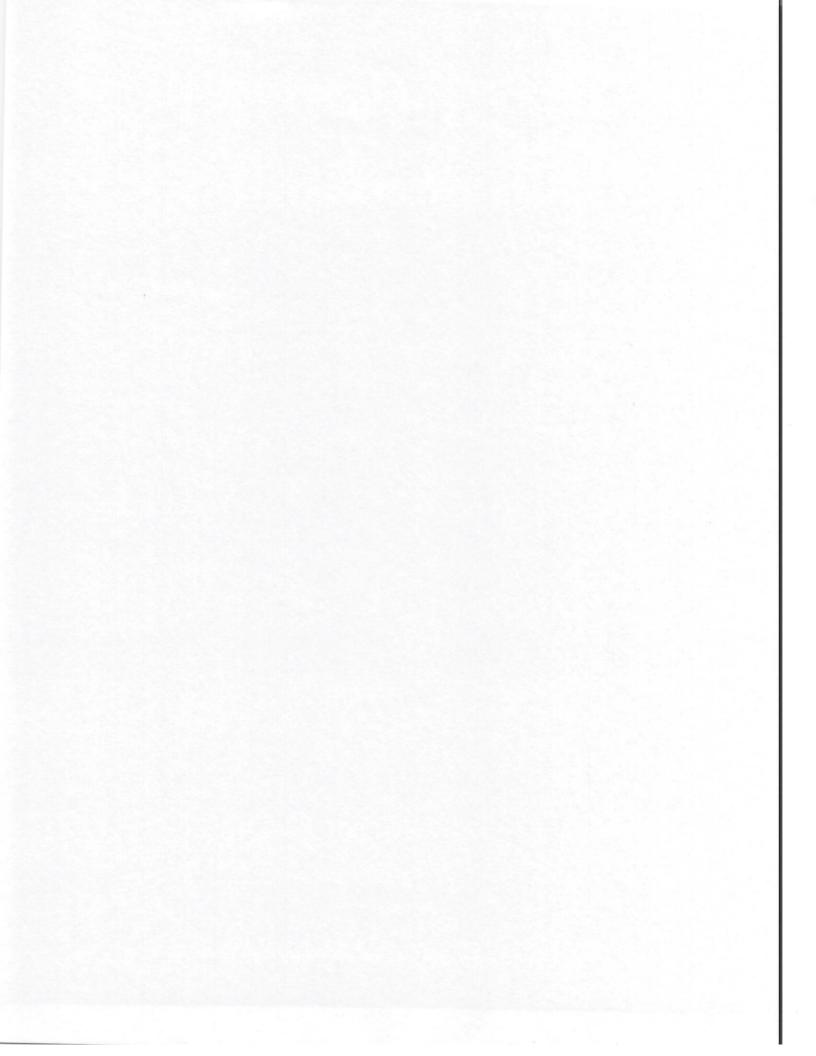
