The Basics Pt. 1

→ Reduced Quantity, Not Quality

Doesn't have to complete everything

→ Extended Time

Assigned Monday & due Friday, give student until next Monday

 \rightarrow Chunk

Make parts due at specified times

Provide a timeline of dates and/or what is expected

→ Multiple Choices

Allow the students to choose which project they want to complete

Choice Board - expectation is 5, others maybe less

 \rightarrow Checklist

Simply give a checklist for students to cross off items as they complete them

 \rightarrow Hands On!

Anything the students can physically create

→ Presentation

Allow the student to videotape before class + play video in class

Present before or after school to just the teacher

FlipGrid

→ Physical Examples

When giving directions, model an example that you or a previous student made

→ Check Point

- Make all of the students turn something in on a timeline
- Random check in while the students are silent reading or completing a bell-ringer type activity

→ One-Step Directions

Give one direction at a time

→ Rephrase Directions

Have students repeat directions back

Rephrase and/or repeat directions everyday with class/individual

Individual & Group

Ever thought about both aspects in one project?

- Each student (or pairs) completes one component of a project that benefits a group.
